
Key Verses: Genesis 18-22

Talk Summary: Abraham and Isaac – Doing what God tells us (obedience)

We are continuing our Origins series looking at the book of Genesis. Last week's instalment brought us the news that God promised Abraham he would become a great nation. God's promise was fulfilled and Abraham and Sarah gave birth to a son called Isaac. We picked up the thread this week and talked about obedience.

Three points were brought out in the talk:

- 1. Obedience can be hard and scary.
- 2. If we are obedient God can use us, but it can look messy as we move through that time. We can't see the end but God can. He weaves us into his story.



- This story is a mirror of another one that happens later in the bible. All these Genesis stories
 point to the big story of God. This story is a hint of God's ultimate rescue plan for the world –
 Jesus.
- 3. God rewards obedience we join all the other people from the past and the future who are the stars God showed to Abraham. He calls us to invite others to become part of that heavenly display.
